Actors' Playhouse Announces Cast and Creative Team for Miami Premiere of Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – October 4, 2023 – Actors' Playhouse is delighted to unveil the complete cast and creative team for the highly anticipated Miami Premiere of **Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas**, a new Cuban American play by hometown heroes Richard Blanco and Vanessa Garcia. The production will grace the stage of the Miracle Theatre in Coral Gables from November 8 to December 3, 2023.

Richard Blanco, renowned as the poet for Barack Obama's second inauguration, collaborated with fellow Cuban American writer **Vanessa Garcia** to create **Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas**. The play was commissioned by Maine's Portland Stage, where it premiered last January.

Blanco, recognized as the fifth Presidential Inaugural Poet in U.S. history by President Obama and honored with the National Humanities Medal by President Biden in 2023, also holds the distinction of being the inaugural Poet Laureate of Miami-Dade County. Vanessa Garcia, an established rising star in the world of theater, has gained widespread acclaim for her recent works, including the immersive sensation *The Amparo Experience*, lauded as "Miami's Hottest Ticket" by People en Español. Her other recent plays include *Jenna & The Whale* at Ground Floor Theatre and #*GRACED* at Zoetic Stage, which received a 2023 Carbonell Awards nomination for Outstanding New Work, Play, or Musical for its recent premiere.

Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas takes audiences on a journey from Miami to Maine and back to Miami. It explores the life of Beatriz, a Cuban American baker in Maine, as she grapples with the decision of whether to remain within the close-knit community she's built or to reunite with her estranged mother in Miami. Along the way, Beatriz rediscovers her sense of belonging as she blends the recipes of her childhood with the raw ingredients of her new hometown.

Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas will feature Melissa Ann Hubicsak (The Amparo Experience, Broadway Factor/BACARDÍ; Last Summer at Bluefish Cove, Ronnie Larsen Presents – Carbonell Award nomination) as Beatriz, JL Rey (Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas, Portland Stage; Ybor City the Musical, NY) as Tio Eme, Conor Walton (Bright Star, Actors' Playhouse; Pageant, Island City Stage) as Blake, Elizabeth Price (What the Constitution Means to Me, City Theatre; Misery, Empire Stage) as Georgie, Michael Gioia (Refuge, Theatre Lab; Grand Horizons, Boca Stage) as Maynard, and Barbara Bonilla (El Huracan, GableStage; The Savannah Sipping Society, Empire Stag) as Marilyn.

RICHARD BLANCO (Playwright) Selected by Barack Obama as the fifth Presidential Inaugural Poet in US history, Richard Blanco was the first Latinx, immigrant, and gay person to serve in that role. In 2023, Blanco was awarded the National Humanities Medal by President Biden. Blanco was a Woodrow Wilson Fellow and has received numerous honorary doctorates. He is the firstever Poet Laureate of Miami Dade County, as well as first-ever Education Ambassador for the Academy of American Poets. Blanco has taught at Georgetown University, American University, and Wesleyan University, and currently is an associate professor at Florida International University, his alma mater, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering (1991) and a Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing (1997). Born in Madrid to Cuban exile parents and raised in Miami in a lower-working-class family. Richard Blanco has navigated cultural identity. sexuality, and sociopolitical matters in his five collections of poetry: How to Love a Country; Looking for The Gulf Motel, winner of the Paterson Poetry Prize and the Thom Gunn Award; Directions to The Beach of the Dead, recipient of the Beyond Margins Award from the PEN American Center; City of a Hundred Fires, winner of the Agnes Lynch Starrett Prize; and most recently, Homeland of My Body, a volume of new and selected poems. Blanco is also the author of the memoirs For All of Us. One Today: An Inaugural Poet's Journey (Beacon Press, 2013) and The Prince of Los Cocuyos: A Miami Childhood (Ecco, 2014), winner of a Lambda Literary Award and a Maine Literary Award. Exploring other genres, he is currently a writing co-executive producer for a TV series adapted from his memoir, and a co-lyrist for Waiting for Snow in Havana, a musical in development based on Carlos Eire's memoir about Operation Peter Pan, a clandestine exodus of over 14,000 unaccompanied Cuban minors to the United States. Blanco's presidential inaugural poem "One Today" was published as a children's book, in collaboration with renowned illustrator Day Pilkey; and Boundaries, a collaboration with photographer Jacob Hessler which challenges the physical and psychological dividing lines that shadow the United States. As a publicly engaged author, Blanco has written occasional poems for organizations and events including the reopening of the US Embassy in Cuba, Freedom to Marry, and the Boston Strong benefit concert following the Boston Marathon bombings, and El Paso shooting. Nationally as well as internationally, Blanco lends his art and voice to advocate for diversity, LGBTQ rights, immigration rights, and arts education. Whether speaking as the Cuban Blanco or the American Richard, the homebody or the world traveler, the shy boy or the openly gay man, the engineer or the presidential inaugural poet, Blanco's writings possess a story-rich quality that illuminates the

human spirit. His work asks those universal questions we all ask ourselves on our own journeys: Where am I from? Where do I belong? Who am I in this world?

VANESSA GARCIA (Playwright) is a Cuban American multidisciplinary writer, screenwriter, playwright, novelist, and journalist/essayist, who has written and worked for Sesame Street, where she's been nominated for an Emmy (Monster Meditation) and won two Telly Awards (Tamir on the Street). She's also worked on Caillou; Behind the Beats (a French animated show about the history of music and how it's all connected), and other shows. She's the author of the novel White Light, which won an International Latino Book Award and was one of NPRs best books of 2015. Her first Picture Book for children, What the Bread Says, launched October 1, 2022. Theatrically, she's the author of *The Amparo Experience*, an immersive hit that People en Español called "Miami's Hottest Ticket." Other plays include: Sweet Goats & Blueberry Señoritas, which she co-wrote with Obama's Inaugural poet, Richard Blanco: #Graced about a woman searching for what it means to be American right now, which premiered at the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts, and Jenna & The Whale, about a town in Florida facing the suicide of a young man, which premiered at Ground Floor Theatre in Austin, Tx in 2023. Her journalism, essays and thought pieces have appeared in The LA Times, The Guardian, The Washington Post, National Review, ESPN, The Hill, Catapult, Narrativelly, and numerous other publications. Vanessa also hosts a podcast about family with her own sister and mother called Never the Empty Nest, available anywhere you listen to podcasts.
